They also have an electric spinning wheel, umbrella swift and ball winder, and sewing machines to borrow.





Visit to Focus: Fiber 2019 exhibit

Kent State University Museum

I recently had the pleasure of attending the Focus: Fiber 2019 exhibit at the Kent State University Museum. Focus: Fiber is a biennial national juried exhibition of contemporary fiber art. This exhibition is co-sponsored by the Textile Art Alliance of the Cleveland Museum of Art (TAA), and Kent State University Museum. The mission of TAA is to increase appreciation of the textile arts through lectures, workshops, and exhibitions, and to support the textile collection of the Cleveland Museum of Art. The show features works created with a wide variety of fiber arts, including knitting, and is well worth a visit. Two knitted pieces in particular caught my eye. One is a circular yoke sweater with an anatomically correct full set of teeth on the yoke. Another is a large illusion knitting wall hanging. The exhibit runs through July 28, 2019.

While you are in Kent, you might also take in the Fashion Meets the Body: Juried KSU Faculty Exhibition, which runs through August 25, 2019, and the Fashion Timeline, which features selections from the Museum's permanent collection and runs through June 27, 2021. Planned Pooling with Variegated Yarns

Judi Pfancuff will teach "Planned Pooling with Variegated Yarns" for the guild on Sunday, September 8, 2019 from 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm at the Orange Village Hall, 4600 Lander Road, Orange Village, Ohio 44022. Class size is limited to 12. The fee is \$20 plus a \$17.50 materials fee for a total of \$37.50.

Knit or crochet with variegated hand-painted yarns to achieve the color pooling effects that you want while avoiding effects that you don't want. A simple online app will be used as the primary tool to analyze your yarn's possibilities. Skill level: Intermediate knitter with experience working both flat and in the round and ability to maintain relatively constant tension. No need to love math!

Bring along: 1) A Wi-Fi enabled smart phone, tablet or laptop, 2) two sets of size 7 knitting needles to allow you to work both flat and in the round (small circumference), 3) a locking stitch marker, 4) a scratch pad and pencil. Participants will receive three 25-gram samples of worsted weight merino yarn in three different dye patterns that they will use to produce argyle, striped and stacked pooling effects.

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Franklin Habit to Teach 2020 NCKG Class

following 4-3 hour classes:

- Photographing Your Fiber
- Working with Antique and Vintage Knitting Patterns
- Knitted Tesselations: Playful and Powerful Patterns in Practice(we had the 3 hour class and this is the 6 hour class)
- Garter Jacquard: Garter Stitch Gone Wild (now titled Garter Party: Garter Stitch Gone Wild with Special Guest I-Cord!) This class is slightly revised and now includes I-Cord Edgings and "afterthought" openings.
